Note from the Director

First I would like to welcome you all to the first Nantwich Players production for what seems forever!

When we first decided that *The Female of the Species* would be a great play for us it was in the calm of the Pre COVID -19 in early 2019.

It was a really funny play and had something of an interesting back story. The play contained an Authors note which sounded far too interesting to ignore. "*The Female of the Species* was inspired by a single image: a feminist of a certain age in the study of her country house, at the end of a long driveway, taken hostage by an angry young woman. While the scenario of this play was inspired by the true-life incident, reported in the world press, involving Germaine Greer and a young student, the characters and story of my play are entirely imagined."

So inspired by laughter and this intriguing story I was looking forward to starting auditions earlier this year and as Christmas was out of the way it was something to look forward to. Then we all got locked down again and we weren't even able to audition in the theatre. That was where we moved the theatre to 21st Century technology and did our initial read through via Zoom. For those not in the know that involves that Internet thingy!

With actors queuing up to get involved, as they had not had their regular injection of theatre adrenalin for so long, the reading was well attended. Then it was a waiting game until we could get together to audition. So as soon as the government advised that we could get back to socially distanced and bubbled rehearsing we got the date in the diary. The auditions went ahead with interested parties signing in, rubbing in gel, donning masks and standing at the other side of the room from me and Artistic Director Garth Jones. Two characters at once, distanced from each other, were auditioned in pairs across two nights and of course we could have no audience.

Then it was rehearsals with bubbles of a maximum of 6 people, so the cast of six and a further bubble of me and the back stage crew, all signing in and keeping a distance – no theatrical luvvie activity allowed!

Then it was set building, which was a challenge as our regular builders were not able to work during the High Risk Covid days – so crack on anyway!

The joy then began as we were allowed to rehearse full steam ahead. The play then lifted us all and often had us in socially distanced fits of laughter. We all loved getting back to doing what we love.

But we made it, we're being cautious for your safety, selling limited tickets, but we will be delivering completely unlimited entertaining theatre and laughter.

Along the way my cast and crew have been amazing, flexible, fun and of course distanced and my sincere thanks go out to them for helping me get this to the stage as one of the first amateur productions in the area.

It's been a long haul, but we're back and loving it. I hope you will too.
